


will have a change in their recycling collection day. If your recycling collection day has changed, vou received a letter in the mail.



The Kannapolis Police Department recently held its annual police awards ceremony. Several members of the Kannapolis Police Department were honored with the most prestigious awards given by the department based on their service and performance to residents and their fellow police officers.

"These individuals represent the very best of our staff. Each one works daily to ensure we have a safe and reliable presence in our community. Their efforts are appreciated and valued in our department," commented Kannapolis Police Chief Terry Spry.



Officer Hunter Wood was presented with the Roger Dale Carter Memorial

Service Award, given in memory of Kannapolis Police Officer Carter, who died in the line of duty on December 31, 1993. This award is presented annually to a sworn officer who has rendered exceptional service, and whose character and integrity exemplify the highest ideals of law enforcement.

**Records Specialist Katie Ruiz was** awarded the Norma C. Howard Memorial Service Award. Norma Howard was the first female and full-time civilian

police employee in Kannapolis and was instrumental in establishing the records management system. This award is presented annually to a civilian police department employee who conducts both their personal and professional lives in a manner that is consistent with the department's values and code of ethics.



Officer Austin Purser received the Rookie of the Year Award. ### CITY RECEIVES FINANCIAL RECOGNITIONS

The City of Kannapolis recently received recognition that its financial health is strong. The City received an award for its budget and a "clean audit" award, both indicators of the financial strength of the

First, The Government Finance Officers Association (GFOA) presented the Distinguished Budget Award to the City of Kannapolis. This is the 23rd consecutive year the City has received this honor.

The award is given to municipalities who publish a budget that is a policy document, an operations guide, a financial plan and is used as a communications device. The Kannapolis budget was found to be proficient in those four categories

and met 14 mandatory criteria in order to achieve the award.

The GFOA also presented the City with special recognition for its long-range operating financial plan. The long-range financial plan for the City's operating budget includes forecasts, trends or other data reflective of the City operating budgets for at least three years beyond the budget period.

Secondly, the City's recent audit report of its finances shows the City is financially sound and, therefore, received a "clean" or "unmodified" opinion. The unmodified opinion from the auditors of Martin and Starnes, an independent auditing firm, means the City has no weaknesses, no

issues and no findings that would signal any problems with the financial health of the City.

The audit report found the City has a healthy fund balance (savings account) and a stable property tax base which continues to grow. The City receives an audit each year in order to meet legal requirements, to be transparent and to ensure there are no issues with the accounting procedures of the municipality.
