FOLLOW THESE GUIDELINES:

- · Bag your garbage.
- · Do not bag your recycling.
- (Plastic bags are clogging the machines at the recycling facility, causing a mess!)
- · Recycling items need to be CLEAN and DRY.
- Put your garbage and recycling carts at the curb the night before your scheduled collection.
- · Remove carts from the curb after they have been emptied.
- · Grey lid cart is for garbage and the yellow lid cart is for recycling.
- Please do not put trash in the recycling carts you will contaminate the entire truckload.
- · Place carts for collection with wheels facing your home.
- Keep carts 5 feet from one another and 5 feet from parked cars, mailboxes, etc.
- · Do not block sidewalks with carts.

Recycling is collected every other week on your garbage collection day.

Way to go, Kannapolis! You deserve a round of applause! You are helping the environment tremendously by recycling tons and tons of materials each month!

The City collects garbage and recycling collection in the City from almost 21,000 homes

and small businesses. Over 70% of these homes and small businesses recycled 3,440 tons last year. This is the equivalent of 404 school buses full of recyclable materials.

As landfills run out of space across the United States, your participation in recycling materials is crucial. Recycling reduces waste in landfills, conserves natural resources and reduces pollution, which saves money for everyone. We thank you for helping our environment and hope you will continue to recycle.

Plastic bags and clothing clog recycling machinery, so we ask that you do not put them in your recycling bin. Most grocery and retail stores have plastic bag recycling programs. Reusable tote bags are a great option and are available at any store versus using plastic bags.

Please never place trash in your recycling cart. When this happens, the entire truckload is contaminated and cannot be recycled.

KANNAPOLIS CITY CLERK RETIRING AFTER 37 YEARS

City Clerk Bridgette Bell is retiring after serving the City for 37 years. Bridgette has worked with six Mayors, 26 City Council members and four City Managers. The City recently celebrated its 40th birthday of incorporation and Bridgette has been with the City for almost the entirety of the City's lifespan.

"I have had the pleasure of meeting lots of amazing people and forming lifelong friendships, both in the private sector and internally with my co-workers. It is with mixed emotions that I say goodbye, but on the other hand, I am excited that I can finally start doing the things that I always said I was going to do, but never actually got around to doing," she said.

Bridgette was hired in the fall of 1987 through a temp agency by Gene McCombs, who was the City Manager at

that time. He asked her to "try out" the position of clerk and she never looked back. She was permanently employed soon after. There had been one clerk prior to Bridgette assuming the position.

In the early years, there were few City employees and Bridgette wore many hats, including finance, payroll, reconciling bank statements, entering water and sewer receipts, and maintaining all the City Council, Board of Adjustment and Planning and Zoning meeting agendas and

minutes.

Three decades later, Bridgette attends every City Council meeting, preparing the agendas and recording the minutes. She

coordinates calendars for City Council members, handles public records requests, fields calls from the public and much more. Additionally, she handles updates to City ordinances, tracks City Council

> resolutions, and signing of contracts and official documents.

She is a native of Kannapolis and a graduate of A.L. Brown High School. She has earned the prestigious designation of Certified Municipal Clerk and

Master Municipal Clerk.
